

Executive MBA Council Elects New Members to its Board of Trustees

ORANGE, CALIF., Aug. 3, 2010 – Members of the Executive MBA Council elected three new representatives to its Board of Trustees: Armando Dal Colletto, dean of Business School São Paulo, Brazil; Louise Kapustka, executive director, Executive MBA program, Michael G. Foster School of Business, University of Washington; and Barbara Millar, director of the Darden School of Business MBA for Executives program, University of Virginia. The new board members will begin their three-year terms after the <u>EMBA Council</u> Conference, set for Oct. 24-27, 2010, in Vancouver, Canada.

Dal Colletto teaches classes in English and Portuguese at Business School São Paulo. He acted as associate dean for EMBA programs from 2004 to 2005, associate dean for corporate programs from 2007-2008 and as dean since 2008. Prior to joining the faculty at Business School São Paulo, Dal Colletto held several management positions at Brazilian and multinational companies, including chief information officer (CIO) of Editora Abril, a large publishing company in Brazil, and CIO of SABESP, a large sanitation company in the Americas. He earned a bachelor's of science in engineering from Escola Politecnica of the University of São Paulo, followed by an MBA from Fundação Getulio Vargas, graduate management courses at INSEAD and graduate courses at Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

At University of Washington's Foster School of Business, Kapustka oversees all facets of program administration, including student, sponsor and faculty satisfaction; alumni engagement; financial performance; marketing and staff development. Prior to joining the Foster School in 2003, she spent many years in the private sector, most recently in market research and product marketing roles at Microsoft Corporation. Kapustka received an undergraduate degree from Oregon State University in education and was certified to teach at the secondary level. She has an MBA from the University of Washington EMBA program. Kapustka serves on the board of directors for Seattle Leadership Tomorrow.

Millar oversees marketing; recruiting, admissions; corporate and alumni relations; and strategy and planning for Darden's MBA for Executives program. Before launching and assuming leadership of the program in 2005, she served as the director of student affairs for the full-time MBA program. Millar has also served in Darden's offices of admissions and financial aid. Previously she worked for the University of New Hampshire's Whittemore School of Business Administration. Her experience includes five years of service to the United States Air Force, working in military intelligence and training.

Millar has bachelor's and master's degrees from the University of New Hampshire, and a doctorate in higher education and leadership from the University of Virginia.
